Nature Camp Staff

Camps are staffed by lead (age 18+) and co-lead (age 16+) camp counselors; all of which have previous experience working with or educating children. We also offer a counselor-in-training program, for students ages 13-15, to help campers learn about the natural environment, native plants and animals, and how to be caring stewards of the Earth.

All staff and volunteers have passed the necessary background checks and are certified in CPR and first aid.

Children ages 6 and 7; runs 9:00am - 3:00pm.

Feet, Fins, & Feathers

June 17-21

Are there animals with Feet, Fins or Feathers that fly? Yes BIRDS! Explore the forests, meadows and waterways to learn all the places birds live. Why don't all birds look the same? Why do some have claws and others webfeet, some have bills and others hooked beaks? Play games, learn bird calls, practice sighting birds through binoculars!

Young Explorers

June 24-28

Hike into the wild! Explore and play while learning basic outdoor survival skills. Solve a riddle to find a hidden treasure, make a sensory map, identify and follow animal tracks, listen to a master storyteller and practice telling your own tale.

Art in Nature

July 1-3 & 5

Discover designs in nature and make your own works of art. Make natural dyes from plants, weave grass baskets, paint with nature's minerals, take pictures with the sun's rays. Make and decorate a group mask for the ECO Camp Art Performance finale.

Wet & Wild July 8-12

Meet aquatic creatures as you explore ponds and streams! Catch frogs and dragonfly nymphs, search for signs of beavers, go fishing at the pond. Learn why and how to keep water clean! Play games, get wet, and construct a boat to compete in Friday's ECO Camp Boat Race.

Creature Features

July 15-19

It's a wild world out there! How do animals and plants compete for food and avoid being eaten? Play games and explore to learn about camouflage, mimicry, migration, and other behaviors used by animals to protect themselves and their food.

Survivor July 22-26

Journey into the wild for a week of outdoor thrills! Be bold and brave as you follow animal tracks and identify wild plants. Build a shelter and create a campfire as you "camp out" for the day. Participate in skill-building games, travel the trails and tell tall tales as you roam the woods and waterways.

Eco Art

July 29-August 2

Explore color in the meadows, tree bark textures, flower and leaf shapes. Let nature be your creative playground and inspiration for painting, crafting collages, mobiles, sound instruments and more! Help create a temporary art installation at ECO Camp.

Stream Stompers August 5-9

Submerge yourself in the world of water. Explore streams and ponds to discover the many plants and animals living there. Find out how you can take care of fresh water while cooling off during water games. Construct a boat to compete in Friday's ECO Camp Boat Race.

Eco Detectives

June 17-21

Venture into the wild this week to hone your investigative skills! Learn to read the landscape, follow wildlife tracks, identify scat, walk the un-nature trail, and set up insect traps. Find and learn about local wildlife and their behaviors by honing your senses. Display your daily discoveries at the ECO Camp Museum.

Into the Wild June 24-28

Hit the trails and build a shelter, forage for edible plants, build a campfire, track wildlife and learn about safety in the wild! Play games to learn, and create your own field guides of the animals and plants you find signs of on our trails and waterways.

Nature's Art Gallery July 1-3 & 5

Art is an expression of you! Use your senses to explore the natural environment. Meet a tree, draw a sound map, take a blindfolded trust walk, and identify the smell of different natural objects. Hike the hills, valleys and along the waterways to find natural objects to use to make something for the ECO Camp Art Performance finale.

Just Add Water

July 8-12

Get your feet wet while exploring your watershed. Hike the stream and probe the ponds in search of aquatic wildlife. Play games and do experiments to learn amazing qualities about water. Make fish prints and construct a boat to compete in the ECO Camp Boat Race. Ah, yes, and get WET!

Amazing Adaptations July 15-19

Mimic or migrate? Find out how adaptations such as camouflage, hunting behaviors and physical features help animals survive. Seek out and observe wildlife in our streams, woodlands and meadows. Construct terrariums for temporary inhabitants; and participate in games to learn about the many adaptations of our local wildlife.

Turtles (continued)

Creative Native July 22-26

The original reducers, reusers, recyclers! Learn creative ways the Native American Lenape lived off of the land. Make a traditional Lenape toy, play "On the Hunt", go fishing and foraging, make cordage, and build a fire. Learn the many ways to use natural materials to make all things needed to survive and play.

Wild Art

July 29-August 2

Nature is full of art. Search gardens, fields and waterways for forms, shapes, patterns and colors done nature's way. Capture spider webs, collect seeds to create a collage, paint with your hands, learn creative ways to journal and sketch in the field, and help create a temporary art installation at camp.

Water Wonders August 5-9

Dive in and discover your watery world! Search aquatic habitats for critters and learn about the plants that live in and near water. Build wetland models and conduct experiments to demonstrate how our waterways become polluted. Get wet while playing in obstacle courses, and construct a boat to compete in the ECO Camp Boat Race.

Smooth, Slimy, & Slithery June 17-21

Discover the world of reptiles and amphibians with games, experiments, and explorations. Visit local natural areas to explore wetlands, seek out creatures and set up traps along the trails. Includes a kayaking field trip.

Eco Trekkers June 24-28

Build survival skills when you take on various quests this week. Learn orienteering and navigation skills needed to chart and follow a course. Hone your compass skills, make a map and set up a geo-cache. Includes a challenge adventure field trip.

Green & Crafty July 1-3 & 5

Immerse yourself in our forests, meadows and waterways to inspire your own works of art. Make tree bark prints, leaf prints, and sun prints. Collect different colored soils and clay to build a sculpture. Make homemade paper. Identify and collect plants and stamp out your own one-of-a-kind headband. Includes a Wednesday evening family campfire program.

Earth, Wind, & Water July 8-12

What fuels nature? Through experiments and games, explore earthquakes and volcanoes, the strength of water, wind, sun and more. Build a weather vane, take a gravity, force, and motion scavenger hunt, construct and fly a kite, and compete in teams in the Egg Drop challenge! Includes a trip to St. Peter's Village rocks.

Herons (continued)

Camouflage, Claws, & Super Sight July 15-19

How do birds adapt to survive? Study birds in action to learn their mimicry, hunting and hiding techniques. Practice skills in identification, songs, calls and behaviors of birds. Learn the physics of bird flight and create your own flying machines. Design your own bird; map out migration routes; and play games to reveal the amazing world of birds. Observe waterfowl and raptors as you meet live birds up close and personal! Includes a birding field trip.

Lenape Life July 22-26

Go back in time to when the Lenni Lenape Native Americans roamed the land. Build a wigwam, play hunting games, learn about plants used for food, medicines and dyes. Make and use traditional hunting tools and learn tracking skills. Enjoy native stories of how things came to be. Includes an astronomy family night (date to be determined based on weather).

Great Artdoors July 29-August 2

Let nature inspire you to create with its variety of colors, textures, and forms. Check out nature's geometry and patterns by measuring, dissecting and drawing. Build a wind sculpture, a string mandala or a lifesize cut out of you! Help create a temporary art installation at ECO Camp. Includes a Wednesday evening family campfire program.

Aqua-Ventures August 5-9

Water adventures every day? Navigate a stream, catch aquatic insects, conduct a water quality assessment, and catch freshwater fish. Visit the Great Marsh and learn about its wildlife. Design a boat to compete in the annual ECO Camp Boat Race. Includes a kayaking field trip.
